

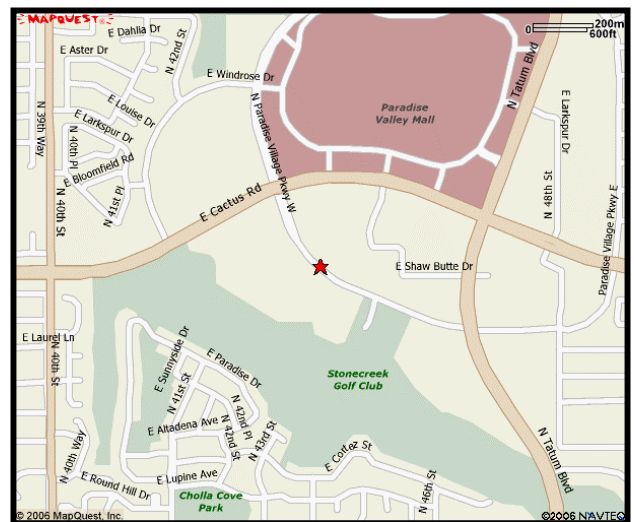
Have you noticed that your eyes aren't as sharp as they once were?
